LEVEL 5 COVID-19 REGULATIONS IN OUR CHURCH

As a result of the reintroduction of the Level 5 Covid-19 restrictions, the Day Chapel in Naomh Fionán will be open for private prayer from 1:30 pm – 7:00 pm each day and all Masses are once again without congregations. Funerals are limited also to 10 persons only.

Points to remember when visiting the Church for private prayer

Always Maintain - 2m (6/7 feet) distance from others outside or your household, while you are in your seats and as you come and go from the church building and grounds.

Always Sanitise - Your hands - on entry and exit from the church building & before and after lighting candles. (Use wipes provided and ensure your hands are dry from the sanitiser before lighting candles)

Always Wear Mask - When in the church for private prayer.

It is VERY IMPORTANT to also remember: Remain safe at home:

- If your health is vulnerable or you feel unsure about coming out
- If you have Covid-19 or have had contact with someone who has
- If you are awaiting results of a Covid-19 test
- If you have a flu or cold like symptoms

By each of us doing our bit, we can help reduce the numbers of Covid-19 and return to a level which would enable us to re-open our church again for public Mass.

COMMUNION TO SICK AND HOUSEBOUND

If you would like to bring communion to someone who is currently housebound, isolating, or ill, please contact Fr. James. Only family members who are living in the same house, or a person who is currently a carer and presently in constant contact with the person(s) may bring communion to those who are looking for it. A person designated to bring communion may only bring it to one household, i.e., not to two or more people in different households.

If you are a new family in the parish or a family who did not receive church envelopes for this year, 2021 and wish to; please drop your name and address into the parochial house during the coming days.
