ATTENDING THE CHURCH FOR MASS - FROM 10TH MAY

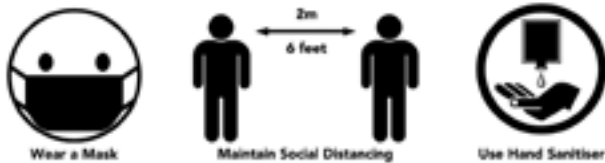
If you would like to attend a Mass in N.Fionán, please consider going to one of the weekday Masses instead of a weekend Mass. There is more availability of space at weekday Masses, than at weekends. Under the current guidelines, once the church has reached its capacity for a Mass, the doors will be closed, and people will be asked to either go to Aras Begley to listen (20 seats available) or return to their car to listen instead. So please consider a weekday Mass if you wish to attend. Thank you.

With social distancing, our church here can accommodate roughly 110 - 118 – two areas/zones in the main church with up to 50 people in each and an additional 18 people in the day chapel.

Please also remember There is no obligation on anyone to attend Mass at the present.

Mass will continue to be broadcast on our parish webcam and parish radio. You can join in with the Mass from your home. Funerals and Weddings: The number of people allowed to attend weddings and funerals will also increase to 50 from the 10th May. While churches may be able to safely hold more with different zones, 50 is the maximum number of people allowed to attend a wedding or funeral.

POINTS TO REMEMBER WHEN VISITING THE CHURCH FOR MASS OR FOR PRIVATE PRAYER.



(Use wipes provided and ensure your hands are dry from the sanitiser before lighting candles)

Please follow the guidelines on social distancing, etc., when attending the church for Mass and follow the direction of the stewards. As it is in all other public building at this time - Please wear a face mask in the church when attending and during Mass, religious service or visiting the church & sanitise your hands on entering and leaving the building.

- If you have Covid-19 or have had contact with someone who has
- If you are awaiting results of a Covid-19 test
- If you have a flu or cold like symptoms
